Why is Occupational information important?

Enrich your ancestor's story
Insight into social status
Distinguish between people with same name
Pass down from father to son
Provide additional genealogical information

How to find your ancestor's occupation

-Census Records -Vital Records -Obituaries -SS Application Records -Military Draft and other Records -City Directories – often lists where employed -Old Pictures

How Can You Find Out More About Your Ancestor's Occupational?

-Research the occupation/industry
-Research the Company
-Research the Location – Museums/Historical Societies/Libraries/Archives
-Read Books hard copy & online
-Watch Videos about the occupation

What Types of Occupational Records Are There?

-Govt Reports – Federal, State & Local -Company Records -Union Records -Occupational Clubs/Societies -Licenses or Certification -Occupational training/Apprenticeship

Where Can You Find Occupational Records?

-On line at sites such as Google Books, Archive Grid and Hathi Trust Example: State Annual Reports on Coal Mines
-Ancestry, Family Search, etc. have some records – may have to search Collection, may not be indexed. Use Family Search Wiki for location.
-Historical Societies, Local History Museums, Libraries, etc. Example: Baker Library, Harvard – Textile Mill Records
-Some online many not online

Examples: Farm Census, State Coal Mining Reports, Railroad Pension Records, Catholic Priest Church Records, Textile Mill Company Records.
